Bill Wilmot read to the assembled group a proposed change to the by-laws. This change would allow individuals or companies to join NNEPAC as Associate (non-voting) members. From the Membership section:

"Section 2.

Associate membership shall be open to any law enforcement agency outside the states of New Hampshire, Maine, Vermont, and Massachusetts: ~~or~~ to any governmental or non-profit agency whose function effects or is affected by the accreditation process: **or to any company or individual involved in law enforcement policy development or the accreditation process."**

This bylaw change will be presented at the March business meeting for adoption by the membership.
