▪ **CALEA On-sites and Mock On-sites**

She suggested that manpower would be greatly appreciated and that NNEPAC could also be a sponsor of the event.

Bill Wilmot moved to have NNEPAC become a sponsor at the CALEA Conference in Providence to the level of \$1,000.00. Jeff Pike Seconded. UNANIMOUS.

▪ Training

There was a lively roundtable discussion of the Charleston CALEA conference by those who attended.

Some of the highlights included:

- Agreement that the conference was well-attended, fun, and that the attendees were well cared for.
- Host night on the USS Yorktown was terrific. It seems that the NNEPAC group was the last one off the boat.
- The PAC President's meeting was hosted by Director Hartley. The Sixth Edition was the primary topic of discussion. CALEA received LOTS of feedback from the field. Display of Firearm is off the table as a reporting statistic. The transition document detailing how the Sixth Edition will be rolled out was shared with the group. The review of the comments from the field is continuing and the Sixth Edition will become reality. It will be presented at the March conference for acceptance. (It will pass)
- The Chair pointed out that CALEA did, in fact, listen to the feedback that they requested.
- The November 2019 Conference (where the first group of agencies in the four year process will be back together) will be in Cincinnati.
- Our NNEPAC Chair spoke at both the SRIC and Full Commission meetings. (We are so proud.)
